Devotional Guide for September 25-October 1, 2011

For this week's devotional time study at least three of these verses each day. Ask the following three questions. Then pray, asking God for help to learn and live each of these commands.

1. How can I apply this?
2. How good am I at this?
3. How do I need to improve?

Romans

Be devoted to one another in brotherly love. Honor one another above yourselves. (12:10)

Live in harmony with one another. Do not be proud, but be willing to associate with people of low position. Do not be conceited. (12:16)

Let no debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to love one another, for he who loves his fellowman has fulfilled the law. (13:8)

Therefore let us stop passing judgment on one another. Instead, make up your mind not to put any stumbling block or obstacle in your brother's way. (14:13)

May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give you a spirit of unity among yourselves as you follow Christ Jesus, so that with one heart and mouth you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. (15:5-6)

Accept one another, then, just as Christ accepted you, in order to bring praise to God. (15:7)

1 Corinthians

I appeal to you, brothers, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree with one another so that there may be no divisions among you and that you may be perfectly united in mind and thought. (1:10)

But God has combined the members of the body and has given greater honor to the parts that lacked it, so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other. (12:25)

Galatians

You, my brothers, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the sinful nature; rather, serve one another in love. (5:13)

If you keep on biting and devouring each other, watch out or you will be destroyed by each other. (5:15)

Let us not become conceited, provoking and envying each other. (5:26)

Ephesians

Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. (4:2)

Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you. (4:32)

Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ. (5:21)

Colossians

Do not lie to each other, since you have taken off your old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge in the image of its Creator. (3:9-10)

Bear with each other and forgive whatever grievances you may have against one another. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. (3:13)

1 Thessalonians

May the Lord make your love increase and overflow for each other and for everyone else, just as ours does for you. (3:12)

Now about brotherly love we do not need to write to you, for you yourselves have been taught by God to love each other. (4:9)

Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing. (5:11)

Hold them in the highest regard in love because of their work. Live in peace with each other. (5:13)

Make sure that nobody pays back wrong for wrong, but always try to be kind to each other and to everyone else. (5:15)

1 Peter

Now that you have purified yourselves by obeying the truth so that you have sincere love for your brothers, love one another deeply, from the heart. (1:22)

Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins. (4:8)
